
General



GETTING STARTED

Switching on for the first time

Turn on yourTV set and select the corresponding AV input (with the AV key, or simular, on the television remote control).

Turn on the main power supply to the STB, the indicator on the front of the unit will turn red and then green. In standby mode, the indicator light will be red. In on mode, the indicator light will be green.

- If you use the STB for the first time or have restored the STB to factory defaults, a "TV Setting" menu will be displayed.
- Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to the desired item.
- Press "RIGHT" cursor button to confirm and press" UP"or" DOWN" button to select the desired option, press" OK" button to confirm.
- Press "UP"or"DOWN" button to select the Automatic Set-up or Manual Set-up and press "RIGHT" to scan for channels.
- When all available radio and television channels have been found, the channel at the top of the list will be shown.



Auto / Manual channel scan

- 1) Press the "MENU" button to enterthe main menu of the STB.
- 2 Press the "UP" or "DOWN" button to select the Installation. And press the "OK" button to enter the Installation menu.
- ③ Press the "UP" or "DOWN" button to select "Auto search" or "Manual search", and press the "RIGHT "button to confirm.

Auto channel scan:

- Press the "OK" button to startsearching.
- Press the "EXIT" button to quit.

Manual channel scan:

- Press the "RIGHT" button to select.
- Press the "RIGHT" button to enter, press the "UP" or "DOWN" button to select "Channel No" section, and press the "OK" button to start search.
- Press the "EXIT" button to quit.









NOTE:

The power will support the external antenna when the STB is connected to the external antenna and the Antenna power is on.

Changing Channels

There are four ways of selecting channels - stepping through the channel list, selection by number, from the on-screen channel list, and using the Channel Schedule.

(1) Stepping through the channel list:

Press the "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to browse up or browse down the available channels.

2 Selection by number:

Enter the complete channel number from the remote control to select desired channel.

3 Selection by on-screen channel list:

You can also select the desired channel directly from the on-screen channel list. This channel list will displayed by pressing the "OK" button on the remote.

(4) <u>Selection by channel Schedule:</u>

You can also select the desired channel directly from Channel Schedule. This is displayed by pressing the "EPG" button on the remote control. The Channel Schedule provides the user with a brief description of the programme on the currently selected channel and other information. Please See "EPG" in this manual for more detail.

Channel settings

From the ChannelList, you can rename and activate the selected channels.

- (1) Press "MENU" button to enterthe main menu of the STB.
- (2) Press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select the Installation.
- ③ Press "RIGHT" button to enterInstallation.
- 4) Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to highlight the Channel settings.
- (5) Press "RIGHT" button to enterthe Channel list..
- 6 Press "EXIT" button to quitthe channel settings window.
- (7) Press"UP"or"DOWN"button to select a desired channel.
- 8 Press" RED"button to renamethe channel.
- Press"OK"button to activate or de-activate channel, the channel
 will not displayed in the channel list if deactivated.



Parental control

From the Parental control window, you can modify the pin code, lock TV channels and set preferences.

- 1) Press "MENU" button to enterthe main menu of the STB.
- ② Press "UP "or "DOWN "button to select the Parental control option. The default PIN code is "0000".
- (3) Press "RIGHT" button enter the Parental control menu.
- 4) Press "UP "or "DOWN "button to highlight the desired item, and press "RIGHT "button to confirm.
- ⑤ Press "LEFT" button to return the super menu.



Parental control continued



PIN Code:

This menu allows to change the PIN Code. Press "RIGHT" button to enter the desired item, enter the numeric number you want the pin code changed to, press "LEFT" button to return, press "UP "or "DOWN" button to select the next option. The default pin code is "0000".



Parental control:

This menu allows you activate or de- activate Parental control, make the parental control valid for 20 min, or activate at the next restart.

Parental rating:

This menu allows you to set the Parental rating. You can restrict viewing by agerating or allow unrestricted access.

Lock TV channel/radio:

This menu allows you to lock the TV or radio channel. Press "RIGHT" button to enter the Lock channel list, Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select the desired channel, and press "OK" button lock, press "OK" button again to cancel, press "EXIT" button to quit the menu.

EPG

The STB supports EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) for 8 days. The EPG displays the programme schedules with short & extended descriptions of the selected service.

- 1) Press the "EPG" button to enterthe EPG menu, the EPG menu contains all the current days event information.
- 2) Press "Left "or "Right "button to change channels."
- ③ Press "Up" or "Down" button to view the Extended event description of the selected event in the event list.
- (4) Press "EPG" button to view the now and next information for all channels.
- (5) Press "EXIT" button to quit the menu.



Favorites

This menu allows you to store a list of your favourite channels. So that you can access them more easily. In this STB, you have four favourite lists to set, each family member can have his own favourite list.

Edit TV lists/radio lists:

- (1) Press "MENU" button to enter the main menu of the STB.
- (2) Press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select the Favorites.
- (3) Press "RIGHT" button to enter the favourites menu.
- 4 Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select the Edit TV lists or radio lists, press "RIGHT" button to confirm.
- (5) Press"UP" or "DOWN"button to highlight the desired favourite option and press"OK" button to confirm .
- 6 Press"UP"or"DOWN"button to select the Channels or Re-name item, press "RIGHT"button to confirm, and press"OK" button to select/remove the favourite program or rename the favourite list.
- 7) Press "EXIT" buttonto quit.

Favourite TV lists/radio lists:

- 1) Press "MENU" button to enter the main menu of the STB.
- (2) Press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select the Favorites.
- (3) Press "RIGHT" button to enter the favourites menu.
- 4) Press"UP"or"DOWN"button to select the Favourite TVIists or radiolists, press"RIGHT"button to confirm.
- (5) Press"UP" or "DOWN" button to highlight the desired favourite list option and press"OK" button to confirm or remove, the selected favourite list will display in schedule of the FAV or not.

Accessing the favourite channels:

- 1) Press "FAV" button to enter the "FAVOURITE LIST".
- (2) Press"FAV" button again to switch desired favourite list.
- ③ Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select the favourite channel in the selected favourite list.
- 4 Press "RIGHT" or "LEFT" button to view more details of the current/next program.
- 5 Press "Exit" button to quit.

Accessing the Channel list

From the channellist, you can change channels available, check the current or next programme information.

- (1) Press the "List" button to enter the Channel list.
- ②Press "UP "or "DOWN" button to change the channel.
- ③ Press "LEFT" or "RIGHT" cursor button to switch the current channels or the next channel.
- 4 Press "INFO" cursor button to checkmore information of the program.
- (5) Press "FAV" button to change the channel list, The channel list is as well as favourite list.
- 6 Press "EXIT" button to quit the channel schedule.



Timer

This menu allows you to set the STB to change channel to play the programs as required.

- 1) Press the "TIMER" button to enter the main menu of the TIMERS.
- (2) Press the "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select the desired item...
- (3) Press the "RIGHT" button to enterthe sub-menu.
- 4 Press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select the desired item and Press "RIGHT" button to enterits sub-menu.

TV/Radio

This option allows you to select a TV or Radio channel.

Channel

This option allows you to select the desired channel.

Date

This option allows you to set the date of the program.

Start time

This option allows you to set the start time of the program.

End Time

This option allows you to set the end time of the program.

Repeat mode

This option allows you to set the frequency for the schedule, Daily, Monday to Friday and Weekly.

Parental control

This option allows you to enable or disable parental control.





SYSTEM SETTING

System setting

The system settings menu allows you optimize the STB to suit your TV and preferences. The System setting menu screen is accessed from main menu.

- (1) Press the "MENU" button to enterthe main menu of the STB.
- (2) Press the "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select the System settings.
- (3) Press the "RIGHT" button to enterthe sub-menu.
- (4) Press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select the desired item and Press "RIGHT" button to enterits sub-menu.
- (5) Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select the desired option and press "LEFT" or "RIGHT" cursor button to select the desired setting..
- 6 Press "MENU" button to return the upper menu.press "EXIT" button to quit. After exitting the main menu, the settings will be valid.

Lanuage:

This menu allows you to set the main, audio and subtitle languages and switch off subtitles.

Time:

This menu allows you to set the time format, and the time offset.

Banner:

This menu allows you to set the duration for which banners are displayed and the transparency.

TV Setting:

This menu allows users to select the output mode of the TV/VCRS cart, the TV audio mode, the digital audio mode and the default volume.

Product info:

This menu allows users to check the STB version information.

Factory reset:

This menu allows you to restore the factory settings. The default pincode is "0000".













HD TV settings

This menu allows you to set the resolution, the TV screen format, and the display format.


